General Cleaning and Spot cleaning

Regular cleaning of reflective glass is essential to eliminate unwanted artifacts such as dust or fingerprints. The following procedure outlines the recommended steps for routine cleaning and spot treatment of stubborn stains or individual marks:

- Begin by using a clean, slightly damp cloth.
- Apply a small amount of methylated spirits to the cloth.
- Gently wipe the glass surface, ensuring that the cleaning agent remains confined to the glass and does not spill over the edges.
- For spot cleaning, focus on the affected area and thoroughly wipe it clean.
- After completing the cleaning process, use a second dry cloth or an anti-static, lint-free towel to carefully dry and polish the area.

When cleaning the glass, exercise caution and employ gentle, circular motions to avoid any potential scratching. It is crucial to use a cloth that is only slightly damp, as excessive moisture can cause damage to the reflective surface.

Prior to applying the cleaning agent to the entire glass surface, we highly recommend conducting a small test on an inconspicuous area to ensure compatibility and prevent any adverse reactions.
